

Why Does Early Childhood Development Matter?


New brain science research provides evidence that shows what happens in early childhood has impact throughout the life span.


Approximately 27% of Alberta's kindergarten children are experiencing developmental difficulties.





Community networks of high quality, integrated and accessible early childhood programs and services will allow parents to access the right services at the right time.



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

Research and Innovation Strategy

Why Do we need a Research and Innovation Strategy?

- An enabler to drive the success of an integrated ECD system is research (including measurement and evaluation) and fast cycle innovation
- Many excellent ECD programs and services currently exist. However, evidence of their effectiveness on improving outcomes is limited.
- Within an integrated ECD system, a clear and well-defined provincial ECD Research and Innovation Strategy will create a shared vision and mandate of how to address the challenges in the current state of ECD in Alberta.

Research and Innovation Strategy



Strategic Goals

- Build awareness of existing research and create ways to utilize current evidence (provincial, national and international).
- Influence the creation of new knowledge to address gaps and anticipate ongoing need for research.
- Create a collaborative environment that enhances relationships between researchers, policy makers, practitioners and the public.

Research and Innovation Strategy

A High Performing Research and Innovation Strategy should:

- · Inform explicit policy directions and best practices
- Facilitate inter-disciplinary and inter-sectoral applied research and evaluation and capacity building
- · Align funding with evidence informed ECD outcomes
- · Be supported by longitudinal, population-based studies
- Generate and mobilize knowledge on a timely-basis decisionmakers, program leaders, and the public
- Build support for the value of ECD to society

Research and Innovation Strategy

What remains to be accomplished:

- Further engagement researchers, government, community
- Further development communication, documentation to suit different audiences and stakeholders
- Support for infrastructure development, including the Child and Youth Data Lab and Child Data Center of Alberta
- Alignment and coordination within overall ECD Priority (e.g. measurement and evaluation, innovation)

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Brain and early childhood development research and KT initiative

- Effort to catalyze interdisciplinary interest and collaboration in advancing and applying integrative knowledge building on the core story of brain development
- Alberta Family Wellness Initiative and Alberta Centre partnering to support seed grants
- Opportunity to build interest and engage other partners too

What defines FOI in Alberta

A set of complementary processes and activities:

- Research and Innovation Strategy
- Brain and early childhood development research and knowledge translation initiative
- Innovation by Design Province

Community Sites
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Innovation by Design Province

- Umbrella for accelerated innovation process in communities
- · Formal sharing with other FOI jurisdictions
- Engaging private, public and not-for-profit partners
- Translation into policy, program and practices

Community Process Steps

- Mapping the landscape
- Identifying the intended result, population, and indicators
- Developing system(s) change strategies
- Preparing for practice innovation

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Innovation Platform: Next Steps

- Building a culture of innovation and communities of purpose:
 - Early childhood and brain development science (core story)
 - Common outcomes
 - · Collaborative leadership
 - Building on existing policy, program and practice innovation opportunities
 - · Testing FOI accelerated innovation process
